A Much Safer Stimulant.

A Sunday School teacher, inculcating temperance, was told by one of the boys in her class that while the battle of Manila Bay was in progress grog was served at frequent and regular intervals to every man on the American fleet. The teacher was not familiar enough with naval regulations to know that the story was absurd, and was much confused. To settle the matter, she wrote to Admiral Dewey, telling him what had occurred and asking him for the facts. She received this kindly and re-assuring reply:

"I am very glad to have an opportunity of correcting the impression which you say prevails among your Sunday School scholars, that the men on my fleet were given liquor every twenty minutes during the battle of Manila Bay. As a matter of fact, every participant, from myself down, fought the battle of Manila Bay on coffee alone. The United States laws forbid the taking of liquor aboard ship except for medicinal uses, and we had no liquor that we could have given the men even had it been desired to do so."
