## Virile Base Ball Don'ts.

Fred. Clarke, Pittsburgh's baseball magazine, has a catalogue of his own, written for the ball club, but it applies with very slight changes to any town or condition in life. Here it is:

1. "Don't Smoke Cigarettes." If you must use tobacco, select a good cigar or pipe.
2. "Don't Drink." Alcoholic stimulants used in moderation may do little harm; they do no good, and are dangerous. Better be a teetotaler and keep out of the way of temptation.
3. "Don't Keep Late Hours." Early to bed and early to rise is still a good maxim. It's the only way for a ball player to keep his brain clear and his body fit.
4. "Don't Gamble." Worrying about an ace field that was beaten last night, or wondering how the horses are running, while play is in progress, are alike distracting. The player should give his entire attention to the game.
5. "Don't Be a Crouch." Cheerfulness is a very desirable quality in anybody—a ball player in particular. Sharp answers and displays of temper on the field interfere with successful work, and sometimes cause enemies that bring about the dissolution of the club.
6. "Don't Procrastinate." If anything interferes with reporting on time, cut it out. Tardiness sets a bad example, and interferes with discipline.
7. "Don't Be a Backslider." If you have an idea that the club is not being conducted properly, tell the manager about it. If your suggestions are good, he'll appreciate them. Players must pull together if they expect to win.
8. "Don't Be a Quitter." If you are getting a bad break in the luck, brace yourself and fight all the harder. Remember, that while one slip may be serious, two may be fatal.
9. "Don't Sulk." If you've been called down, the chances are that you deserved it, and you'll gain nothing by showing your teeth. Try to give the club the best that's in you at all times.
10. "Don't Bait the Umpire." Baseball law gives him the advantage over you at all times, so it doesn't pay to oppose him. Besides, the practice of disputing decisions on the slightest pretext disgusts the patrons. The captain will attend to all the necessary flogging.

## Flies, a Plague of Plagues.

Typhoid fever and summer complaint of children are two diseases for which the fly is chiefly responsible. In the Spanish-American war disease killed more soldiers than bullets. Typhoid fever was prevalent in all camps, and many regiments which never left American soil found the common house-fly more deadly than the enemy's guns. The actual loss to this country from typhoid fever approximates \$350,000,000 each year. In New York City alone, seven thousand children die annually from summer complaint.

The manner in which these diseases are transmitted will be seen to be quite direct and simple. The flies, always eating or drinking, wander over decaying garbage, refuse, and other filth, or about the helpless bed-ridden sick, in search of food. At these times their tiny feet, wings and bodies become covered with millions of bacteria, or disease germs. When the meals are being prepared, or at the table, the same flies walk over the family food, leaving great numbers of germs upon the victuals, which soon enter the human body. A similar procedure transpires when flies are allowed to congregate about the baby's milk or its bottles. "A fly in the milk may mean a baby in the grave."

The thought of such conditions is repulsive, but the actual damage to health, and loss of life is incalculable. Is it not worth the while of every housekeeper to take all possible precautions to exterminate this pest? Has not every occupant of the house the right to see that his health be safeguarded? A nation-wide effort is to be made during the coming summer to enlighten the people concerning this evil, and to prevent the prevalence of flies. The success of the campaign will depend upon each individual doing all he or she can. Below are a few hints which, if rigidly observed, will go far toward freeing your house of flies.

Screen all doors and windows, especially those of the kitchen and dining room.  
Keep all food in the pantry covered or screened.  
Flies breed only in the presence of filth. Do not allow decaying matter to exist in or near your house.

Keep the lid on the garbage can. See that your sewerage system is in good order.  
Use plenty of fly paper, but keep it out of reach of children. Keep flies away from the sick. Sticky fly-paper, traps and lighted incense are among the best devices for use in killing flies, but the latest, cheapest and best is a solution of formalin or formaldehyde in water. A spoonful of this liquid put into a quart of a pint of water and exposed in the room, will be enough to kill all the flies.

The committees have decided not to seek contributions or solicit funds, believing the individual interest and participation of all the town people the most valuable aid. **TOWN ORDINANCE.**

An Ordinance to provide for the im-  
provement of portions of certain streets  
in the Town of Hammonton, New Jersey,  
with sidewalks and curbing, in accordance  
with the provisions of the Charter of the  
Town of Hammonton and an Act of the  
Legislature of the State of New Jersey,  
approved on the 16th day of April, 1909,  
entitled "An Act to authorize and em-  
power any municipality in this state  
to improve any road, street, highway or  
other public highway herein with suitable  
curbing, gutters and sidewalks, and provid-  
ing for the payment thereof."

Be it enacted by the Town of Ham-  
monton in Council assembled:

Section 1. That the following named  
portions of streets in the Town of Ham-  
monton shall be improved with sidewalks  
or curbing, or with sidewalks and curb-  
ing, in accordance with the provisions here-  
inafter made:

Both sides of Central Avenue, from Bolle-  
vue Avenue to Walnut Street, shall be  
improved with both sidewalks and curb-  
ing; excepting however, the north side  
of the said Central Avenue from Vine  
Street to Third Street, which shall be im-  
proved with curbing only; and excepting  
also the south side of the said Central  
Avenue from Third Street to Peach Street,  
which shall be improved with curbing only.  
Both sides of Third Street, from Orchard  
Street to Maple Street, shall be improved  
with both sidewalks and curbing, excepting  
however, the South Side of said Third  
Street from Central Avenue to Third  
Street, which shall be improved with curb-  
ing only. Both sides of Peach Street, from  
Egg Harbor Road to Central Avenue shall  
be improved with both sidewalks and curb-  
ing. Both sides of Second Street, from  
Peach Street to Third Street to Central  
Avenue, which shall be improved with curb-  
ing only. Both sides of Second Street, from  
Bellevue Avenue to Cherry Street, and both  
sides of Orchard Street from Horton Street  
to Third Street shall be improved with  
both sidewalks and curbing.

Section 2. That all sidewalks (not here-  
inafter provided to be made of gravel or  
of some other suitable material) and all  
curbing which shall be laid or constructed  
under the provisions of this ordinance, shall  
be made of Portland Cement Concrete, in  
accordance with the provisions of this ordinance  
shall be made of concrete, and all cement sid-  
ewalks and curbing laid or con-  
structed under the provisions of this  
ordinance shall conform to the longitudinal  
grades or profiles established on that cer-  
tain map made by Mr. J. C. Remington, Jr.,  
Town Engineer for the Town of Ham-  
monton, under the authority of the Town  
Council of the Town of Hammonton, which  
map is entitled "Map showing profiles and  
location of all curbs and sidewalks on cer-  
tain streets in the Town of Hammonton,"  
and was formally accepted by the said Town  
Council on the twelfth day of June, 1912,  
and ordered filed with the Clerk of the  
Town of Hammonton.

Section 3. That the width and location of  
the cement portions of all sidewalks here-  
in provided for and the width of the por-  
tions of said sidewalks paved with gravel  
or with some other suitable material, and  
the thickness and the depth of said sid-  
ewalks and curbing, and all details of im-  
provements herein provided to be made,  
shall, unless otherwise herein provided, be  
in conformity with the data, measurements  
and specifications contained in that certain  
map made by Mr. J. C. Remington, Jr.,  
Town Engineer for the Town of Ham-  
monton, under the authority of the Town  
Council of the Town of Hammonton, which  
map is entitled "Map showing profiles and  
location of all curbs and sidewalks on cer-  
tain streets in the Town of Hammonton,"  
and was formally accepted by the said Town  
Council on the twelfth day of June, 1912,  
and ordered filed with the Clerk of the  
Town of Hammonton.

Section 4. That the data, measurements  
and specifications appearing in the said map  
of Mr. J. C. Remington, Jr., be, and the  
same hereby are, made a part of this  
ordinance, in so far as the said data, mea-  
surements and specifications relate to the  
above named portions of streets in the  
Town of Hammonton herein provided to be  
improved with sidewalks or curbing, or  
with sidewalks and curbing, excepting such  
of the said data, measurements and speci-  
fications as may conflict with the provisions  
of this ordinance.

Section 5. That if any person or persons  
owning or occupying property abutting on  
the portions of streets herein ordered to be  
improved, within thirty days after this  
ordinance shall have been passed, notify  
the Town Council of the Town of Ham-  
monton of his or their own expense, and in  
all respects as specified in the foregoing  
provisions of this ordinance, such person  
or persons shall be deemed to have agreed  
to make the said improvements, and shall  
be liable to make the same within sixty  
days after the passage of this ordinance,  
which time the provisions of the ordinance  
relating to such portions of the said streets  
as shall not be improved by the persons  
giving the notice aforesaid, shall remain  
in full force and effect.

Section 6. That the benefits of such im-  
provements as shall be made by the Town  
of Hammonton under the provisions of this  
ordinance, shall be assessed upon the said  
Town of Hammonton and upon the property  
abutting upon the streets herein ordered  
to be improved, and collected, according to  
law.

Section 7. That the Town Clerk of the  
Town of Hammonton be, and he hereby is,  
authorized to send a written notice to each  
of the owners of property abutting on the  
streets herein ordered to be improved,  
which notice shall contain a copy of this  
ordinance and a statement of the time when  
the same was introduced into the Town  
Council of the Town of Hammonton, and  
of the time when the said ordinance will  
come up for final hearing and decision; and  
further statement that when the said  
ordinance shall come up for final hearing  
on the day named the owners of property  
abutting on the portions of streets herein  
ordered to be improved will be given oppor-  
tunity to make objections to all or any of  
the provisions of this ordinance and the  
improvements therein provided.

Section 8. That the Town Clerk be and  
he hereby is authorized to proceed to adver-  
tise for bids for the work hereinbefore provided  
for and report thereon to council for con-  
firmation or rejection, and that the aforesaid  
improvements shall be made under  
written contract.

Section 9. That all ordinances or parts  
of ordinances inconsistent with any of the  
provisions of this ordinance, be, and the  
same are hereby repealed; and that this  
ordinance shall go into effect immediately.
