Special School Meeting.

Called to order by the Clerk at 8.20 p.m., Saturday, July 9th. Orville E. Hoyt elected Chairman; W. R. Seely, Secretary.

Resolutions were introduced, authorizing the purchase of the Tilton-DePuy lots, bounded by the M. E. Church property, Bellevue Avenue, the Presbyterian Church, and Vine Street, -150 x 300 feet, -for \$5000; and empowering the Board of Education to issue five notes of \$1000 each, to cover the purchase money, -first note payable Dec. 21st, 1911, and one each Dec. 21st thereafter, until all are paid.

Ballot was taken, and the resolutions declared adopted, -the vote being 27 in favor, two against.

Our Lady's Day.

To-day will occur the thirtieth annual celebration of the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, by the Italians of Hammonton and vicinity. Special trains, teams, and automobiles will bring into town thousands; and in point of numbers, this will be the biggest day of the year.

Three bands, -two from Philadelphia and our local, - will furnish music, parading at 7.30 a.m. and at intervals, in the parade, and give a concert before the fireworks.

Masses will be said at St. Joseph's Church at 8, 9, and 10 o'clock.

At 8.30, the parade is scheduled to start, taking in Bellevue, Main Road, Fairview, Railroad Avenue, and back to the Church.

A grand display of fireworks will be set off at nine o'clock, on the Walther lot, Third Street.
