

### Our Lady's Day.

Hammoncton was a very populous and lively town, last Saturday. Italians by the hundreds gathered here to celebrate their great Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Crowds of Americans came also, to witness the unique doings. Our streets and stores were crowded with people of all grades, from far and near, in holiday attire. Special trains brought them, many came in great wagons, and in carriages, autos and bicycles were used, and many came a-foot.

Arches of brightly-colored lamps spanned Bellevue Avenue and Third Street, and adorned the front of St. Joseph's Church. Three bands filled the air with music; fire crackers made a racket; numerous stands for the sale of anything from peanuts and cream to more solid food, fruit and trinkets, added to the general interest. A few merry-go-round and ocean-wave-made amusements, for organ and monkey man delighted the children.

It was certainly a great day, with more people in town than the oldest inhabitant ever saw here before. It was generally an orderly crowd, excepting a very few cases among those who brought with them an insatiable thirst, which not even a moderate quantity of fire-water would assuage. Plenty of policemen were on duty, however, and took care of those who were overcome by the ram demon.

At 3.30 the procession started from the church, and—covered—the main route. This never fails to arouse much interest.

In the evening, the crowd gathered to see the fireworks reminded one of the ocean beach at the bathing hour on a busy day. The display was very good, though hurried on by heavy clouds and rolling thunder. Just at the close it rained, raised as though old Jupiter Pluvius would revenge himself for the delay. Most of the crowd were without protection; and such a scintillation!

Men, women and children, teams of all kinds, stands and their contents, were moving in haste, everybody seeking shelter. Pretty garments were soaked by the downpour, pretty faces clouded by discomfort. It was not a shower, but a storm.

But now that it is over, all class it as a day to be remembered.
