An ORDINANCE declaring the attendance of any person at the public schools of the Town of Hammonton who cannot show conclusive evidence of recent vaccination to Board of Health, to be a menace to the public health, and prescribing the penalty therefor.

Introduced at meeting of the Town Council, May 25, 1901.

Passed by same June 29, 1901.

Section 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Board of Health of the Town of Hammonton, that the attendance of any person at the public schools of the Town of Hammonton, who cannot show conclusive evidence of vaccination, to the Board of Health of said Town, is hereby declared a menace to the public health of the said town.

Sec. 2. That any person who cannot show conclusive evidence of vaccination to the Board of Health of the Town of Hammonton, shall be debarred from attending the public schools of the said Town.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect from the date of its final passage.
