#### The Tilden Tomato.

Enterprising farmers always desire a variety of crops. It is never safe to depend upon one, because there is no one that will not sometimes fail. It is always safest to have on hand the most of what are general ly considered profitable varieties, that is those that will yield a fair profit in seasons when they do well, and which can generally be depended on to do well.

In some sections of the country-in Del aware and on Delaware bay shore in New Jersey, the tomate is extensively grown and found profitable. It has been experimented with in this vicinity, but has not been found sufficiently profitable to warrant caltination for market. It grows well and yiekla abundantly, but does not ripen at the right time The first tomatoes in market command exhorbitant prices, and the last also, but be tween the first and last of the crop there. are several weeks when the price will hardly pay the expense of picking. The trouble here, has been that the tomatoes would persist in ripening just in this cheap time; and after rep ated trials our growers have given it up in disgust, and yet with much reluctance, as it is a pleasant fruit to cultivate and market, and exceedingly profitable when it can be got to market in the right time. A variety of tomato that would reome this difficulty would, we believe, be found of great advantage here; where a greater variety of products is needed, and ould become as popular as the Wilson

We are pretty well satisfied that the Tilden Tomato can be profitably grown here. It has all the requisites for a first class market tomato. It is red, large, very smooth and very handsome. We regard it also as superior in flavor. We heave never caten any that we think equal to it, and unhesitatingly place it ahead of all others in this respect. It also dresses well for the table, being unusually solid for so large a. truit. While it has all these excellencies it has another of great importance in this vicinity, and that is its early ripening. Mr. S. D. Holman of this town produced it to some extent this year for the first time and found it quite equal to his expectations. He set his plants in the field and had sufficient-ripe truit-for table use, on the lath of July. When his were first ready for market, tomatoes were bringing two dollars a basket. We need not remind those versed in tomate culture of the profit of a few days picking at this price. Another excellent leature of the Tilden is it ripens its fruit more rapidly than most other varieties.

Some of our readers will think this mus be a perfect tomato. We certainly think it about as near that as we are like'y to get, in the toniate ling at least, and hope our agriculturists will give it their attention. We are satisfied from what we have seen and heard of it-and we visited Mr. Holman's field for the especial purpose of learnwhat might be possible concerning it-that it can be profitably grown here, and prove a valuable crop, especially to those not ver beginning to realize from their leuit. Mr. Holman expects to grow it extensively next year. Whether he will furnish reeds or plants can be learned by applying to him.

#### New Jersey Fruits.

Hon. Wm. Parry of Cinnamouson, re cently delivered an essay on this subject before the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society of which the following is a synopsis. To was irst published in the Inquirer.
