ORDINANCE.

An Ordinance providing for the extension of the Sanitary Sewer on Packard Street in a southeasterly direction from Believne Avenue and on Peach Street in a southeasterly direction from Believne Avenue and on Peach Street in a southeasterly direction from Pachard Street in the Town of Hammonton, Atlantic County, New Jersey, and providing that such extension shall be undertaken as a local improvement with assessment of benefits.

Section 1.
