### Successful Prohibition.

Cornwall, New York, has been a no-license town for seven years. During that time the value of its property has risen nearly eight per cent. Real estate in Cornwall is higher per acre than that of license towns in the same county, higher than that of the county-seat, higher than that of Port Jervis, the end of a division on the Erie Railroad. The cost of maintaining in Cornwall fell under the no-license times, and keeps falling. There has been no jail in Cornwall under no-license. There was a jail in license times, and every one put into it for many years was put there for drunkenness, with one exception, and that one stole to buy a drink. In contrast with this, the little town of Mariborough, with no saloon and only Raines law hotels, had in one year a bill of nearly \$400 for the punishment of drunks and of disorders that came from drinking.

We gather these facts from a little campaign document sent out by the no-license citizens of Cornwall. The voters of that town evidently do not regard prohibition as a failure. After a trial of seven years, they voted it in for the eighth time.—Union Signal.

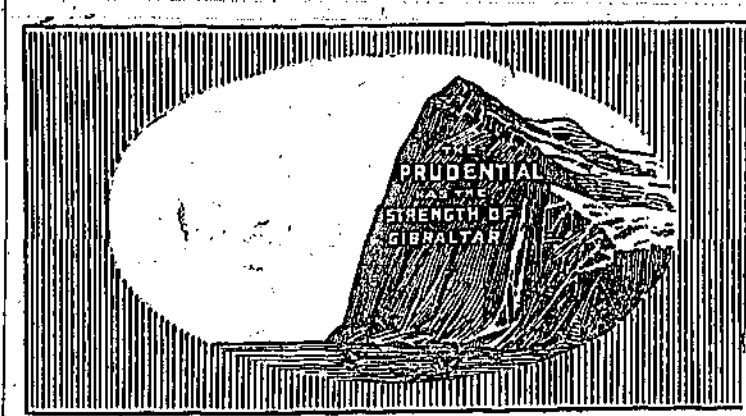
