To the Citizens of Hammonton: September 12 has been designa-ted as the day for the big draft, when all men between the ages of 18 and 45 (inclusive) must register, under the new Selective Service

I, therefore, call upon every patriotic citizen to fly the American flag on that day-from his resideuce and also his place of business. Gen. Crowder has asked that not only every flag be flying, but also every band be playing. Lend your-selves to the spirit of the day.

I furthermore ask that on that day, at 12 o'clock, noon, the church and school bells be rung, and the fire bells tapped, and the factory and other whistles be blown, in honor of the event. Approximately 3.000,000 men will register throughout the United States, and it is the duty of every citizen to show his spirit.

Let there be no slackers in Hammonton; instead it is hoped that every one eligible for registration will go to the Board early and thus prove his willingness to stand ready in defense of his country. Hammonton boys have done nobly so far-let the good work continue. MICHAEL K. BOYER, Mayor.





War Time Sweeteners

MERICA has several excellent war time sweeteners that will be used largely during the shortage in the augar supply. They are maple sugar, syrups, honey and molasses and may be used in preparing desserts and other dishes requiring sweetening. When a cup of syrup or honey is used Ito replace a cup of sugar the liquid in the recipes should be decreased one-fourth. One-third of a cupful of sugar is equivalent

to one-third of a cup of honey, about one-half cup of syrup and about one-half cup of corn sugar. One-fourth of a cup of sugar is equal to about one-half cup of syrup or one-third cup of corn sugar. One table-spoon of sugar is equal to one tablespoon of honey, about one and one-half tablespoons of ayrup and one and onethird tablespoons of corn sugar.

Sugar may be saved by the use of raisins, dates, figs, dried pears and fruit pastes used on the breakfast coreals. Fruit marmalades, butters and jellies should be used to take the place of the ordinary sweetening at a meal and not as accessories to it. Fruits may be preserved without sugar. It may be added when sugar is more plentiful.

Preserving demands this year a thin syrup instead of a

If sugar is used one-half of the amount may be replaced by another sweetener. Drying is a means of preserving (without sugar) ap-

ples, cherries, atrawberries and black caps.

When ready to use they may have added the needed sugar in the form of a syrup. When sugar is more plentiful fruit juices may be made into jellied or may be used as fruit juices with or without sugar, as beyonages, fruit geiatine and frozen desserts. Fresh fruits supply the place of sugar in the diet. They should be used freely. Desserts where sugar is scarce may be made of gelatins, junkets, custards, puddings and





AN ORDINANCE

An Ordinance to Facilitate Traffic on the Streets of the Town of Hammonton and Providing Penalty for Disobedience thereof. Be It Ordsined by the Mayor and Town

Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Hammonton:
Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for carriages, automobiles, blcycles, or other vehicles to park or stand on Bellevue Avenue within fifty feet of any street or avenue intersecting with Bellevue Avenue between Railroad Avenue and Third Street beth street inclusive on Third Street both streets inclusive, on Third Street both streets inclusive, on Twelfth Street within fifty feet of any street or avenue between Grand St. and Railroad Avenue, on West End Avenue within fifty feet of Twelfth Street, on Egg Harbor Road, Second Street, Horton Street, Central Avenue and Third Street within fifty feet of Bellevue Avenue, or within ten feet of any fire plug or public drinking fountsim.

plug or public drinking fountain.
Sec. 2. The above mentioned distance is to be measured from the nearest curb line of said streets or avenues.

Sec. 3. No vehicle shall be parked or

allowed to stand on any street or avenue elsewhere than close to and parallel with

elsewhere than close to and parallel with the sidewalk or footway. Sec. 4. Nothing herein shall be taken or construed to prohibit any vehicle from taking on or letting off of passengers or the loading or unloading of merchandise on any part of the above named streets

or avenues.

Sec. 6. That for each and every violation of this ordinance the offender shall be liable to a fine of uot less than

shall be liable to a fine of not less than two (2) dollars or more than ten (10) dollars and the costs of prosecution.

Sec. 6. If any section or part of a section of this ordinance shall be declared illegal or void it shall not effect any other portion hereof.

Sec. 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 8. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.


