

## Fruit Growers' Union.

As we stated last week, application was made in the New Jersey Court o Chancery, by creditors of the Fruit Growers' Union for the appointment of a receiver to take charge of or close up the business. On Tuesday last, Vice-Chancellor Gray granted the petition, and appointed William Bernshouse, placing his bond at \$30,000. Report places the Society's liabilities, including apital stock, at \$53000, with assets amounting to but \$26,000. We have before us their unnual report for the year ending Jan. 1, 1898, in which liabilities, not including capital, are book accounts, etc., \$52,199.54.

twenty-five years ago, it was intended as co-operative in the marketing of produce. A little later it was decided to purchase fertilizers and feed, to supply the members at cost. Still later, a room was partitioned off-about 12 x 20 teet, in one corner of the shipping house, and farming utensils, etc., added to the stock; then groceries. Then a larger room was given this department, and finally a flue large two-story building erected, and a heavy stock of general merchandice kept, - including furniture and carpets. Only a few years ago their annual report showed store sales amounting to nearly one hundred housand dollors. Three years ago, when the present depression began, their sales were over \$62,000; and there was usually a net profit over all expenlitures, from which a dividend was

The present difficulty can be traced back a number of years, and was caused, probably, by too extensive purchase of goods not always in demand; but principally by too liberal credit, the result of which is a statement lu the last report of "due on notes, mortgages, and book accounts, \$24,481,84." Much of this cannot be collected, though every Ladies' or Gent's dollar was supposed to be good when charged. But three years of poor crops and low prices have left many a berry grower in ead shape, floancially. Jan. lst there were 645 members, with 4933 shares of stock.


