



#### About Typhoid Fever.

MR. EDITOR: At the present time there is considerable agitation among our citizens over what they say is a "typhoid epidemic." Being in a position to know the exact state of the public health, I would like to say that up to date (Sept. 29th) seven cases of 'typhoid have been reported. This, in a community of the size of Hammonton, is a very good showing.

Several of these cases are now entirely-well, one died, while the thers are recovering.

The cause of some of them has been traced to the drinking water (wells, not town water), and the remainder-is-supposed-to-have originated from bad milk. Samples of our-town-water-are-now-in-the laboratory, for examination,

The Board of Health is trying every means to prevent the spread of this dread disease; - but it-is-up to the people themselves to follow every rule of hygiene in preparing food-and-the-proper-care-of-mill




