**Town Council Meeting.**  
 An adjourned meeting was held  
 on Tuesday evening, Sept. 27th.  
 All present.  
 Approved minutes of last regular  
 and two adjourned meetings.  
 The new fire district ordinance  
 was taken up, minor amendments  
 made, and passed second reading  
 after prolonged discussion.  
 Mr. A. J. Rider, delegate to the  
 State Shade Tree Convention, held  
 at Trenton, made a verbal report,  
 giving a number of good sugges-  
 tions in regard to municipal regu-  
 lation of planting, choice of trees,  
 and their care.  
 Fire Chief, and Co. No. 1 report-  
 ed that the ladder truck is satis-  
 factory, and LaFrance Company's  
 bill for same, \$1195, was ordered  
 paid by unanimous vote. This  
 leaves \$142.54 in the fire depart-  
 ment fund.  
 Voted, to hold another adjourned  
 meeting on Thursday eve, 29th.  
 Mr. James V. Baker tendered  
 his resignation, which was laid on  
 the table.  
 Adjourned at 10.43.

**THURSDAY EVENING.**  
 All members present except Mr.  
 Baker.  
 The new dog ordinance taken  
 up and passed third and final read-  
 ing,—to take effect immediately.  
 Clerk was instructed to procure  
 one hundred copies of same.  
 Ordinance fixing the salaries of  
 Councilmen, was referred to the  
 Finance Committee.  
 A resolution defining boundaries  
 of grading and drainage district  
 was introduced, discussed in Com-  
 mittee of the whole, amended, and  
 then adopted.  
 Chairman of the Highway Com-  
 mittee was authorized to employ a  
 competent surveyor to formulate  
 specifications for grading, drainage  
 and sewerage within district above  
 defined.  
 Voted, to appropriate from the  
 license fund sufficient money to  
 pay for work ordered above.  
 It being stated that the dam at  
 the foot of the Lake is in an unsafe  
 condition, it was voted to ask the  
 County Freeholders about making  
 needed repairs.  
 Adjourned at ten o'clock.


