A N Amendment to an Ordinance en-
titled "An ordinance providing for
the licensing of circuses, menageries,
theatrical exhibitions, moving picture
shows, and other amusements," intro-
duced July 6th, 1908, and passed August
15th, 1908.

Amendment introduced Sept. 5, 1908.
Passed October 8, 1908.

Be it ordained by the Town of Ham-
monton, in Council assembled, that the
portion of Section two of said ordinance,
relating to the license fee for theatrical
or minstrel shows be amended to read as
follows: "For theatrical or minstrel
shows one dollar (\$1.00) per day for the
first week, and twenty-five cents per
day thereafter."
