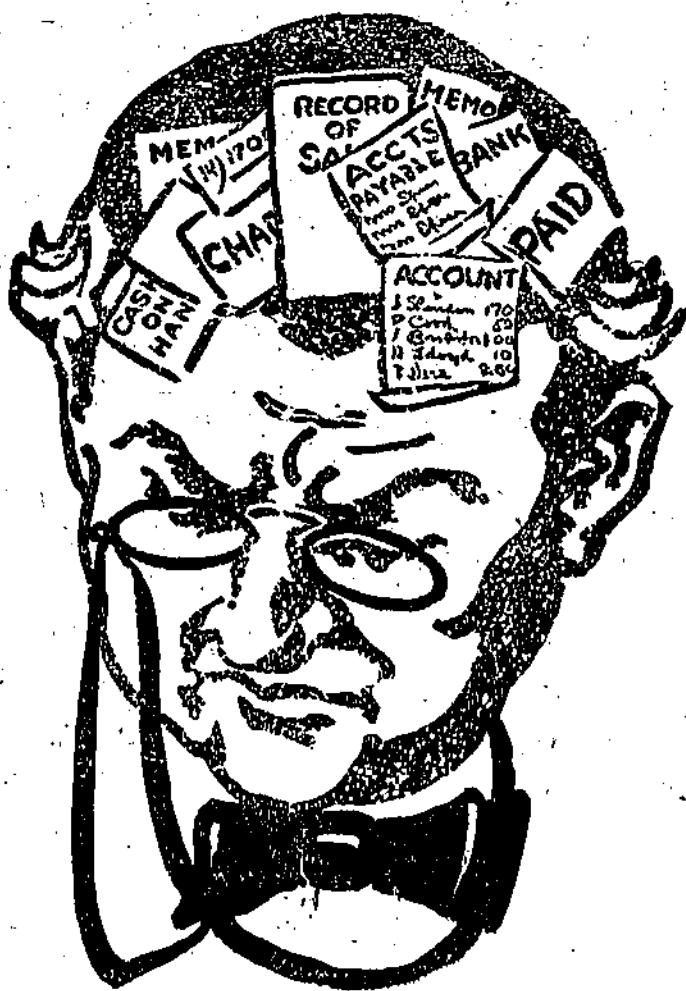

OFFICIAL NOTICE TO Station Owners in Atlantic County.

The fourth annual public examination of all stations offered for building purposes in ATLANTIC COUNTY, N. J., will be held at Hammonton, at the Hotel Stables, on TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 1911, at 2 o'clock p.m.

The station law provides that all stations offered for public service in this state shall be assembled each year, and every person, firm or company, is hereby notified to present their stations for such examination before the Examining Board.

All building certificates of registration, transfers, permits or license certificates must be presented to the Secretary of the Board for inspection and tabulation on that date. Persons desiring further information in reference to Chapter 212 of the Laws of 1908 should address the Secretary at New Brunswick.

AN ORDINANCE Fixing the Salary of Town Clerk.

Introduced October 11th, 1911.

Passed October 23rd, 1911.

Section 1. Be it ordained by The Town of Hammonton in Council assembled, that the salary of the Town Clerk shall be five hundred dollars a year, payable monthly.

Section 2. And be it ordained, that this ordinance shall take effect on the first day of the year one thousand nine hundred twelve, and continue in force until a different rate is fixed by ordinance of Town Council.

Section 3. And be it ordained, that all ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed.

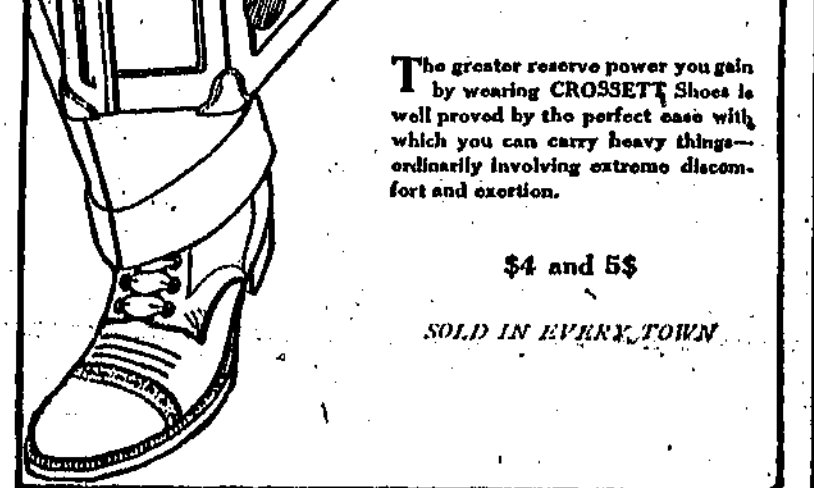
