AN ORDINANCE fixing the salary
of Councilmen.

Introduced June 27th, 1910.

Passed November 9th, 1910.

Section 1. Be it ordained, that mem-
bers of Town Council shall be entitled
to receive from the Town of Hammonton,
the sum of thirty-six (36) dollars
per year, as salary.

Sec. 2. And be it ordained, that this
ordinance shall take effect immediately.


