**The Revolution in Cuba.**  
*Progress of the Insurrection. Arrest of*  
*Havana. Arrests of Ministers. The*  
*Arrival of the Captain General.*

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 24, 1865.

The Pacific railroad is progressing rapidly, but its ups and downs are not confined to the hills and down-ways, over and through which it passes. Serious charges have been made to the Secretary of the Interior and the President, concerning the manner in which much of the work is done, and a special commission, composed of gentlemen of whom I have no objection, has been sent to thoroughly examine the roads to determine the condition of the route.

This charge is that the Union Pacific railroad is not construed in compliance with the requirements of the statute, and particularly that the portions recently built are first-class roads. That in places the roadbed is not of sufficient width, nor well constructed, and that important structures are placed over streams where the water is high and rapid.

The thing which looks unfavorable to the Government is this; that the insurrection had been in existence in the same locality for more than thirty days, without being crushed out by the authorities, and that something has happened in the Yucatán Alps, but, though they had been informed of it, nothing report for the last month, nothing done, nothing done to crush it out.

This was well known in Havana, though it was not officially at the Palace, that the Cubans had overthrown their King, and that many of his officials had fled. The news of the revolution was received with alarm, and the alarm spread far and wide. That alarm was increased by the arrival of Captain General, and the 10,000 men he brought with him.

The alarm caused all the immediate building of a strong line of road, which enabled the company to make extraordinary headway, and locate their roads hundreds of miles beyond the point that would have been reached by a state of things, with the Government.

The thing which looks favorable to the Cuban government is that in all probability it would require about five millions of dollars to put the road already located in first-class condition.

It is alleged that two branches of the road—namely, that portion connecting the port of Santiago with the city of Pinar del Río, and that from Santiago to Matanzas, have been made good, and encouraged, too, by many who have not been charged, in forwarding arms to the rebels.

The situation is different. Different districts of the island are besieged by the sympathizers of the rebels. Extraordinary measures are adopted, and all sorts of extraneous force are used, to secure the success of the insurrection, and of those who have fled, leaving thousands of provisions and unable to proceed. It is reported that some 30,000 to 35,000 of the wealthiest people in Santiago have fled to the United States, and that the number of insurgents were then over 20,000.

The road is said to be in the condition of a military road, but there are no troops.

The Spaniards say that there are not of the insurgents more than, at the outside, 20,000. According to the *Times*, the insurgents have made breads and intend to fight the Spanish soldiers directly.

It is stated in the Cubans that there are in the Tuna District at least 10,000 men under arms, that many who have either fled or gone to the United States, and that these, together with those who remain, were numbering 15,000.

There is one thing which makes me think the insurrection will be withheld until the coming winter.

Will the fall consideration thereof be given by the President?


