Imhoff's Mill Burned.

Early Sunday morning, between twelve and one o'clock, Imhoff's great saw and planing mills took fire, and despite heroic work by firemen and helpers, was entirely destroyed. Sheds, lumber piles, coal yard, and office building surrounded it on three sides, and the on fire several times were all saved by hard work and many stand-pipes of water.

The wind was blowing fiercely, straight down the County Road, setting fire to several buildings, down-to-and-including Walther's blacksmith shop. Had the wind changed to west, nothing could have saved that section of town, as blazing cinders, as large as a man's hand, were borne by the wind for squares, the air seeming alive with them. It was the worst sight we ever witnessed.

Telephone poles across the road were burned almost through, cross-arms were ruined, lead cables were melted, and houses beyond the railroad blistered by the fierce heat. Nearly every fireman, and several volunteers, carry burned faces or hands.

At five o'clock many of the firemen were sent home, but several kept the hose going on danger spots until near noon.

The office roof has about twenty holes burned in.

Besides the building and expensive machinery, which were partially covered by insurance, there were loads of finished and partially completed work, and many valuable tools, belonging to workmen, all destroyed.

The fire was discovered about 12.40 a.m., by night policeman J. W. Myers, in the open log-room on the north-west side of the mill. He immediately rang the big bell, hearing which, the local telephone

operator sounded the gong and the alarms in firemen's homes, assisting in getting the men out quickly. Notwithstanding the racket, several citizens knew nothing of the conflagration until about Church time, that morning.

The mill was, until a few years ago, owned by W. H. Bernshouse, who had succeeded his father, Mr. Wm. Bernshouse, and has a wide reputation for the excellent work it turned out.

We hear praise on all sides for the heroic work of our firemen, in saving adjoining property, at the risk of their own lives.

Rumor has it that Mr. Imhoff will rebuild, at the Pleasant Street and Railroad Avenue corner, of concrete. For the present, he has fitted up a shop in one of the sheds and is turning out work by hand.

The origin of the fire is not yet known, but opinion is divided between the midnight freight train and a sleepy "drunk" who may have taken refuge there.

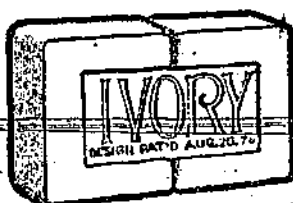

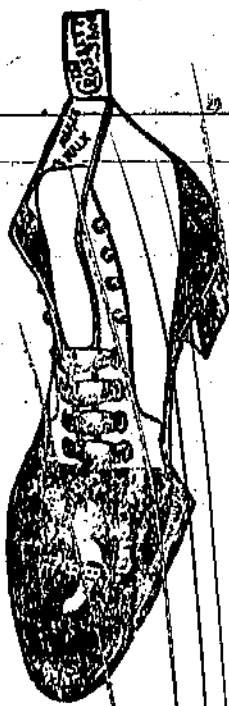
