All Roads Lead To Hammoncton.

There's one advantage that Hammoncton possesses, that many of our people have not thought of, and that is, we are fast becoming the purchasing center for many miles around. You have but to step into our stores, between trains, and see the strangers, making purchases—and no mean purchases either. And automobiles, too, from suburban towns, are awaiting outside the doors, for their owners to do their trading.

Towns as far up as Atco, and down to Egg Harbor, and from Newville to Indian Mills, are appreciating the fact that better clothing, at more reasonable figures, can be bought here than in the cities; and nearly every other article, from shoes to a roast of beef, from a cigar to a baker's mince pie, a doll to a full-sized farm wagon, a crate of eggs, or berries, to a bank account, and a bottle of medicine to a car-load of feed can be purchased here, just as good, just as cheap, from reliable dealers, without wasting an entire day and carfare to the cities.

There was a time when many of our householders imported their provisions by the box full, from Philadelphia; but they too have had their eyes opened.

We advise those of our readers who live in the vicinity of Hammoncton, to drop in between trains, and see for themselves.

Some of our good temperance friends favor a Commission government because they would have an opportunity to vote against legalizing saloons. Why didn't they seize a better chance a month ago? Town Council controls that matter, and during the past year two of its seven members voted every time against granting a license. The same work that is being done for a change might have filled two of the three vacancies with men of like views; and four against three would have made Hammoncton a "dry" town, a consummation most devoutly to be wished.

The self-appointed committee have again postponed presentation of their Commission Government petition. Well, the weather has been wet and cold, and some people will wear thin-soled shoes.

An Expensive Experiment.

Sit down, reader, and consider what three Commissioners would have to do, were they the ruling power in Hammoncton. The Town Clerk, Collector and Treasurer, Water Commissioners, Sewerage Commissioners, Overseer of Highways, etc., would disappear, and these offices or employ men to attend to the business.

Which course would they adopt? If they decided to do the work, what grade of men would you prefer for Commissioners? They say that "better men" would be chosen. Can you pick out these? And would they accept the responsibilities? Of course, with all this business on their hands, and being required by law to meet at least once each week, they would have little time to conduct business of their own; yet if "better men" are to be elected Commissioners, they would not be such as have no daily duties of their own, except to absorb three meals. You would scarcely trust your personal affairs to such men, would you? But men with the necessary qualifications might not agree to abandon their own business and serve the Town; or, if they did, the legal limit of salaries would be none too large as compensation.

Take the other way. They would name a man as Town Clerk. We doubt their ability to find a man as well qualified as the present incumbent; and no fit man would serve for a less salary than is now paid. As the Commissioners fix all salaries, they would employ the best and pay him well.

The same is true of our Collector and Treasurer. Hammoncton never had a better; and we predict that any change in salary would have to be an increase.

In the Water Department, we pay \$300 per year for management. Would any one man do the necessary work for less? No one could reasonably expect the Water Commissioners to do the book-keeping, rendering bills, collecting rents, and accounting; their combined salaries would not induce a competent man to attempt it all; and the Town Commissioners would have to employ a good collector.

The Sewerage Commission find their work quite similar to that of the Water Department, and when the system is in operation, another account will have to be employed.

We have honestly tried to find an economical provision in the 1911 Commission law, and its intricacies; but it isn't there. It would be a costly experiment, and once adopted, must be endured six years.
