Dwight L. Moody, the evangelist,
who broke down a month ago in the
midst of his work in Kansas City, and
was compelled to return to his home to
East Northfield, Mass., died on Friday,
Dec. 22nd. Mr. Moody first knew on
Thursday evening that he could not re-
cover, but was satisfied, saying, "The
world is receding and Heaven opening."
Dying Friday forenoon, Mrs. A. P. Pitt,
Mr. Moody's daughter, said, "Father,
we cannot spare you." His reply was:
"I am not going to throw my life away;
if God has more work for me to do, I'll
not die." At noon exactly, he passed
into the new life.

The death of Mr. Moody removes the
greatest evangelist of this century, who
was known and loved all over the civil-
ized world. He preached the religion
of Christ in its broadest, best, and full-
est sense, the gospel of honesty, puri-
ty, happiness, and square dealing. He
cared but little for forms and ceremon-
ies and fashionable churches, but met
men at the door of their workshops, and
cheered them with kind words and
noble aspirations. His whole life has
been devoted to the uplifting of human-
ity. He was gifted with marvellous
powers of eloquence and personal influ-
ence. The world is better because he
lived in it.

Edison's early wanderings brought
him, at seventeen years of age, to the
Cincinnati office of the W. U. T. Co.,
where his absorption in electricity and
predictions of its future power confirmed
the sobriquet "Lunatic" which clung to
him even until his fame was established.
"We have the craziest man in our
office," said the manager. "He does
all sorts of queer things. I wouldn't
be surprised if he should turn out to be
a genius, some day. Let me tell you
his latest prank. We have been much
annoyed by cockroaches. They infested
the sink. They don't now. Lunatic fixed
them. He ran two parallel wires round
the sink, and charged one with positive
and the other with negative electricity.
Bread crumbs were then scattered, and
when Mr. Cockroach appeared and put
his little feet on the wires, ashes were
all that remained to tell the tale."
