LET'S HAVE UNDERGROUND WIRES

Council Wednesday morning passed on first reading an ordinance granting to the Delaware & Atlantic Telephone Company franchise rights in the various sections of town, for underground and overhead extensions of their system. It is understood that the Delaware & Atlantic corporation will in the future bury a large portion of their wires if the franchise is granted.

This place has on a number of occasions been at the mercy of storms, with all wires to outside points out of commission, and it is felt by many business men that only through the increasing number of wires being placed underground can better service be secured. The ordinance granting the franchise will be submitted to Solicitor Corio, and a public hearing be given the same before it will be brought up for final passage.

The Hammoncton girls' quintet "ate 'em alive" in the game with the girls' team of the Western Electric Company of Philadelphia. The locals won by the score of 32 to 2, the visitors not making a single field goal throughout the game. Miss Ethel Steen, with six field goals, starred for the locals.

STOCKWELL DELIVERS EXCEL- LENT ADDRESS

A splendid turnout of members marked this week's meeting of the Kiwanis Club. The attendance prize was given by Yale Stockwell, and won by J. Mace.

The speaker of the day was Counsellor Henry F. Stockwell, of Camden. A half dozen Ocean City Kiwanians were present, they afterward participating in an inter-city trapshooting match with Hammoncton Kiwanians, led by Robert S. Smith, of Elwood, one of the best shots in the country.

Counsellor Stockwell gave a most excellent address, his subject being the conditions which pervade the country today, from a law observance and law enforcement standpoint. He made it clear that there can be but one kind of honesty, one kind of morality, and one kind of law observance. That a man who deliberately breaks one per cent. of the laws is not 9 per cent. a law observer and respecter, but a 99 per cent. law breaker. That only by obeying the law, and teaching respect for the same, through the home, the school and the church can the United States be brought back to normal status.

Counsellor Stockwell was warmly commended for his address, and the points developed. William Bernshouse, who is 88 years old today, was the guest of honor of the club.

BOB SMITH MAKES 48 OUT OF 50 SHOTS

The first of a series of inter-city contests between trapshooting teams of the various Kiwanis Clubs of this State was won by the Hammoncton Kiwanis Club, which beat out the Ocean City Kiwanis Club team by two points. Hammoncton winning by the score of 189 to 186, in a five-man, 50-birds each contest. The return match will be shot off on Thursday at Ocean City. The Pleasantville Kiwanis Club team will meet the local team here on Tuesday, April 3.

Robert S. Smith, who won the national championship of the "Indiana," a trapshooting organization, winning a \$5000 diamond studded gold medal at the 1921 tournament at Lakewood, led the Hammoncton shooters, bringing down 48 birds out of 50. The records of the other contestants follow: Hammoncton, Edward Cordery, 98; Dr. Clifford J. Waas, 84; Wilson S. Turner, 84; William H. Gardiner, 84; Ocean City, H. Bice, 41; Dr. Whitaker, 40; Albert Smith, 40; Charles Sack, 35; H. Wallace 32.
