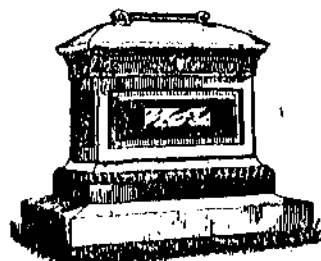

MIXED JURY EXONERATES DRIVER.

A Coroner's Jury, presided over by Coroner Cunningham, composed of three well-known young women, of Hammonton and three elderly men, exonerated Maurice J. Ellis, of West Philadelphia, of causing the death of Reuben Clanton, aged 30, who was struck about two weeks ago by an automobile driven by Ellis. The accident occurred on the White Horse pike, opposite the Amato Arsenal reservation, when Clanton and another colored man, both of whom were former service men, attempted to get out of the way of an oncoming car, and stepped into the path of the Ellis car. The members of the Coroner's jury were Miss Jeanette Brooks, Miss Cecelia Coast, Miss Frances Skinner, John Rizzotte, Nicholas Cashan and J. L. O'Donnell, the latter being foreman. The two sections of the jury were humorously referred to as "May and December."

MEMORIAL COMMITTEE MEETS.
At a meeting of the representatives of a number of organizations of Hammonton, held Thursday night, it was decided to dedicate the \$4000 granite memorial to the service men of this place on Memorial Day. Four committees were appointed to carry out the plans of the general committee.

The sub-committees are those of program, on entertainment and reception, on decorations and on documents to be placed under the massive granite memorial. Another meeting will be held on Thursday evening of next week, when additional organizations will likely be represented. All organizations are invited to send representatives.

Those participating last night, through their representatives, were the Daughters of the American Revolution, Woman's Civic Club, American Legion Post, Town Council, Patriotic Order Sons of America, Hammonton Chamber of Commerce and the Boy Scouts.

LOCAL IMPROVEMENTS.

One of the finest improvements made on Bellevue avenue for some time past is nearing completion at the foot of Second street, a landmark here, has been removed, a splendid concrete steps placed at the front entrance to the store, and one of the best laid cement pavements that Hammonton possesses laid down in front of the premises. The basement is being converted into a subway tunneling parlor, to be occupied by John Helzer, the steps and a handsome railing being already in position.

SEVEN FIRES LAST MONTH.

Chief Albert L. Jackson, head of the Hammonton fire department, has reported to Council that the local firemen responded to seven alarms last month. One of these was a call to Elwood, sent in by some unorganized person. Fortunately the Hammonton firemen were only about half way down when they were informed of the lack of necessity for their appearance.

Food and No Food.

American housewives propose to do without some of the food they otherwise would place on the table so the starving of China may eat. American farmers are gazing with sad eyes upon bulging corn sheds and grain elevators. They are faced with a problem of disposing of surplus food in a land that has too much food.

American housewives mean well in their self-denial movement. But—self-denial isn't necessary. There is food, plenty of it, for China's famine-stricken. The trouble is this—the food is in American warehouses and the starving are in China. The problem is to get them together.

Obviously the starving cannot be brought to the food. The food must be taken to them. Farmers themselves have started corn gift clubs, and have sent carloads to the Pacific. Smaller American meals won't help get those carloads overseas. What China needs more is a sudden and heavy pouring out of dimes and dollars. These will get food to China.

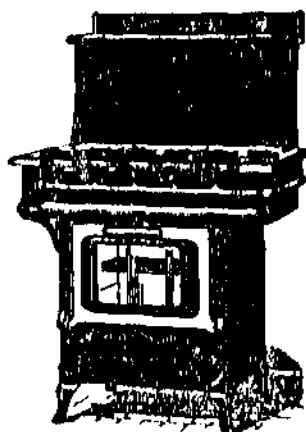

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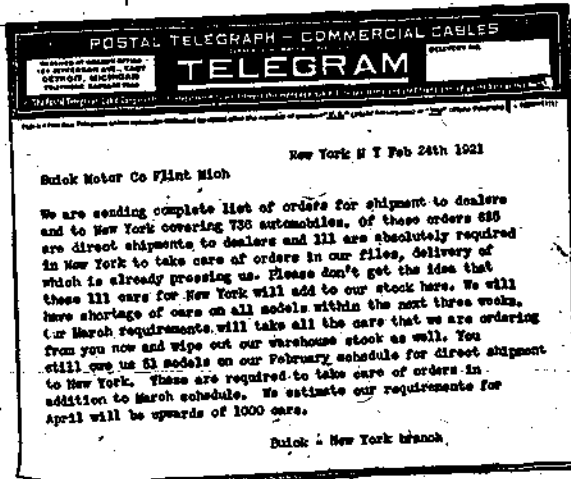
