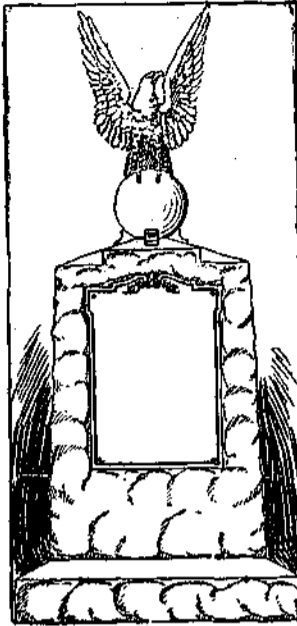

FIRE DRILL

Hammonton firemen Monday night tried out a new plan of fighting fire with the chemical apparatus. A big pile of wooden boxes had been placed in position in School Park, and lighted as the fire bell tolled the practice call. When the firemen reached the scene this heap of boxes, well doused with oil, had become a mass of flames. The chemical apparatus was soon brought into play, reducing the flames greatly. When the tank was empty a section of hose was attached to the chemical and by means of the smaller hose on that apparatus a small but powerful stream of water was hurled into the flames. This method of fighting fire will be adopted in such cases as the chemical fails to extinguish a fire, and the use of the large hose would deluge the premises, causing heavy loss by water, as has been the case several times in the past.

SHORT WEIGHT—TRIED

Tried before Justice of the Peace George E. Strouse, on complaint of Edward W. Strickland, superintendent of the Atlantic County Department of Weights and Measures, the Fish Products Company, of Atlantic City, was fined \$50 and costs for selling fish scrap fertilizer, in this section which was underweight. It is alleged that a number of farmers in this section failed to receive the quantity paid for, one man, former Freeholder William J. Black, bringing charges against the concern whose bags supposed to weigh one hundred pounds were found to be from 8 to 25 pounds under weight. Former Judge Joseph Thompson attempted to absolve the fertilizer concern by showing that some of the ingredients were of such a nature as to easily evaporate, but Justice Strouse failed to see the force of this plea and found the Atlantic City firm guilty, imposing the penalty above stated.

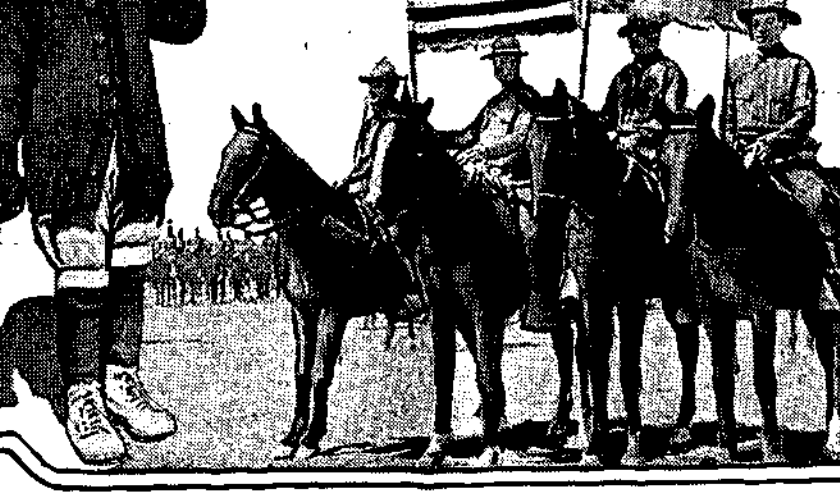

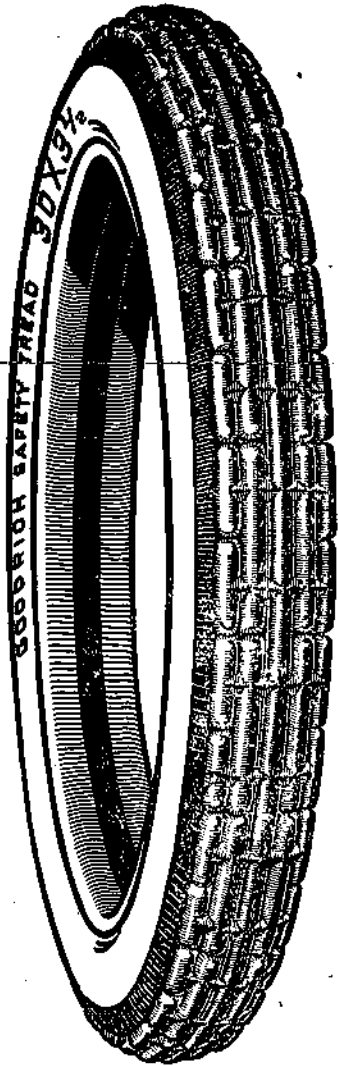

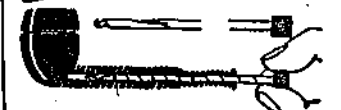
