ANOTHER MOTOR ACCIDENT

Another serious automobile accident, the third at this place within a week, occurred here Sunday evening, when the Ford car of Antonio Zizone of this place, crashed into the Cadillac car of Jack A. Brodie, of 608 South Fourth street, Philadelphia, resulting in the serious injury of Anthony Eimo, age 23, a passenger in Zizone's car, and lesser injuries to Zizone himself and Albert Tomasello, who was riding with Zizone.

Rame was hurled out of Zizone's car, clear over the Cadillac, striking the curb thirty feet away. His spine was seriously injured, and he was rushed to the West Jersey hospital, Camden, for treatment. Brodie was scarcely bruised, but both cars were badly damaged.

The accident occurred at the corner of Third street and Fairview avenue, Zizone going up Fairview avenue, from the town proper, while Brodie was coming slowly down Third street to Ruberton's garage, he having had trouble with his car.

BIG FIRE AT BERLIN

The ringing of the fire bell on Saturday night, tolled as it was in a most unusual manner, aroused the curiosity of a big crowd of shoppers and promoters, who thronged to the downtown fire house, where they ascertained that a big fire was burning in Berlin, fifteen miles from this place, and that help had been requested of Hammononton to extinguish the same. Owing to the fact that one of the engines at this place is temporarily out of commission, it was deemed advisable to send the other apparatus. Fire companies fromaddonfield, Laurel Springs, Clementon, Blackwood, West Berlin, too, and other points responded, and the fire was brought under control. The big grange hall, and several residences, were badly damaged, and for a while it appeared that the entire town was threatened with destruction.

HELD FOR DEATH
The coroner's inquest into the cause of the death of Alfred Simpson, age 35 years, of Philadelphia, who was killed here late Sunday night, a week ago, while returning to Philadelphia with his wife, Nannie, who was also seriously injured, resulted in the driver of the Hammononton car, Antonio Zizone, being held in \$5000 bail to answer the Grand Jury. This is an increase of \$2000 on the amount set originally, pending the result of the inquest.

From evidence adduced at the inquest it would appear that the Simpsons had stopped their motorcycle to make repairs, that they were engaged in that work at the time when Zizone dashed into them at high speed, that their lamps were burning.

Witnesses testify that Zizone was on the left side of the street for a considerable distance, that he was running at high rate of speed, and that one or more of his lights were out.

C. O. C. ON THE JOB

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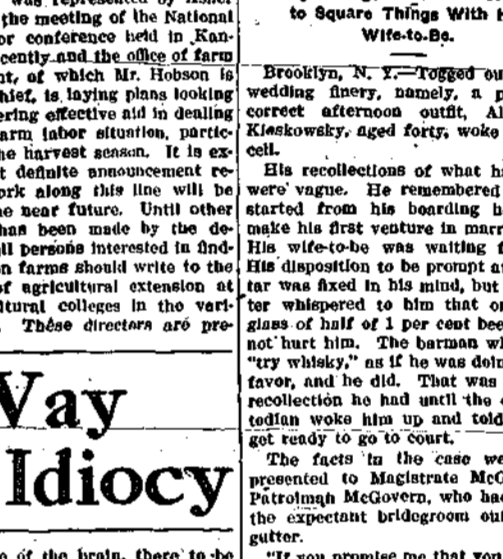

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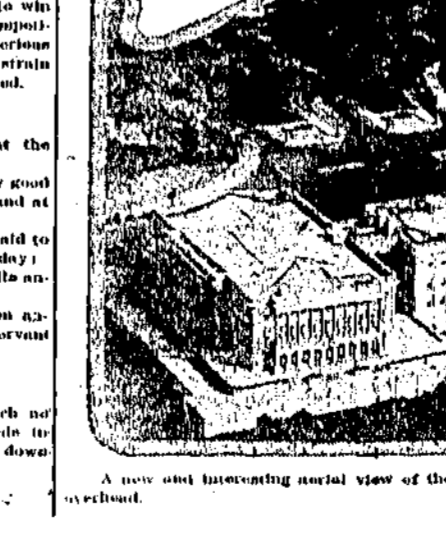
