UNVEIL MONUMENT TO WORLD WAR VETS

Hammononton Honors Sons Who Served Country; Town Turns Out.

The dedication ceremony incident to the unveiling of the monument to former service men of Hammonton was marked by one of the largest audiences ever gathered at Hammonton function. A chorus of two hundred school children, directed by Miss E. Sophia Beebe, supervisor of music, sang patriotic airs. The exercises were opened by the presentation speech of Herbert G. Doughty, chairman of the General Memorial Committee. The dedicatory invocation and the American Legion dedicatory ceremony followed. Dr. Charles Cunningham and Dr. Frederick C. Burt, Mayor of Hammonton and President of the Board of Education, respectively, accepted the monument, and eight markers for the municipality and the school board, the latter as custodians. Oliver Allen, of the Eighteenth Infantry, First Division, made the oratorical address. W. Richard Seely, district clerk of the Hammonton Board of Education, then presented P. A. Fauson Post with a handsome silk Post flag, the gift of the Memorial Committee. Mrs. A. J. Rader presented the Post with a bank account representing contributions made by citizens some time ago to give the returned soldiers a home-coming celebration. Hon. Edward J. Cottell, of the staff of Hon. J. Hampton Moore, Mayor of Philadelphia, delivered the dedication address. It was full of wit and humor, as well as pathos. Prior to the dedication exercises the members of the American Legion with a guard of honor, and the Moose band, paraded from the Post and Gym Club to the site of the monument. MEMORIAL DAY
Today was a busy day for the mem-
bers of P. A. Post No. 186, American
Legion, participating in both mem-
orial exercises and the departed
comrades of the World War, and the
1918 War, in both Government and
Club ceremonies. And at the dedica-
tion of the granite memorial to the
244 service men and women of this
place, four of the fair sex having been
Red Cross nurses in military hospitals,
held in the afternoon.

Accompanied by the Mass band and
other former service men, and represen-
tatives of various organizations, the
Legion members, matched to the Road
ing Railway station, were enthusiastically
awaited them for Government cemetery,
impressive ceremonies being held there.
Returning to the station the procession
marched on foot to School Park, where
other contingents took them to Park-
dale cemetery, where the services were
repeated. In the afternoon the Legion
members took a conspicuous part in the
dedicating exercises at the unveiling of
the \$1000 monument to service men.
The Memorial Committee presented the
post with a handsome silk post flag.

TRAIN KILLS TWO
Antonio Cappucco, aged 18 years, one
of the most widely known Italian in-
this section, was instantly killed, and
Michael Dongo, aged 24 years, was fa-
tally injured, about a half hour later,
by being struck by a south-bound ex-
press at the Southern Jersey Railroad at
Folsom, last Friday evening about 4:45
o'clock. Cappucco leaves a widow and
four children, Dongo a widow and seven
children. Coroner Charles Conington
of this place, is investigating the tragedy
and will likely hold an inquest early next
week.

As near as can be ascertained the men
were in a motor truck driven by Cap-
pucco, and approached the fatal crossing
without being aware of the oncoming
train. The crossing is unprotected, save
by a signal bell and it is believed that
the men failed to hear this because of
the noise of the motor. Cappucco was
badly cut by the impact of the first mov-
ing train. Dongo, who was seated next
to the full force of the blow as did
his friend. The truck was demolished.

HIGH SCHOOL NEWS
The graduation exercises of the 1921
Class of the Hammoncton High School
will be held in the First Methodist Epis-
tolic Church, of Hammoncton, on Fri-
day evening, June 10. The class will
leave for the trip to Washington on
Monday next.

Hammoncton High athletes did not fare
as well as anticipated in the dual meet
held at Vineland, winning but one head
place, Lambert Monfort having that
honor, taking the 220 yards dash for
Hammoncton High, with Youngman, of
Hammoncton High, in second place, Vin-
land leading but one point to Hammoncton's
eight points in that event. In the
100 yard dash Vineland took first place,
with Youngman second. In the shot put
Agner, of Hammoncton High, won third
place, Monfort, of Hammoncton High,
took second place in the quarter mile
run, Dodge getting third for Hammoncton
High in the mile run. Hammoncton won
10 points in all, with Vineland a winner
by a goodly margin.

munity.

plan submitted by outsiders, and if
further work on the same is done it
will be subject to the opinion of the South
Jersey Republican of this place. The
Star is also working on a well illustrated
booklet, entirely separate from the
above mentioned project, and has over
a dozen contracts for its publication.

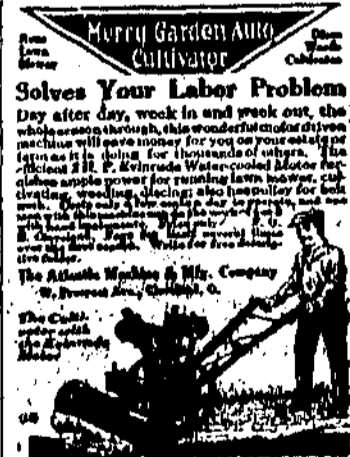
