## IS THIS TRUE?

A sensational story is going the rounds here that the identity of the persons who blew up Hotel Schultz at Pileom, May 20, has been discovered, that one of these men is a crack shot and has sworn that he will never be taken alive. Four men are said to have been concerned in the deed, two from Philadelphia and two from this place.

## DEMAND LAW ENFORCEMENT.

Residents of this section are demanding better enforcement of law than has been the rule during the past year. The bombing of Hotel Schultz, three miles from this place, remains unpunished, several persons have been killed by speeding automobiles and those responsible are still at liberty, while indications point to the escape of the murderers of aged Matteo Ingema, unless the county authorities break their record and arrest the real criminals. Friends of Charles S. White, accused as an accessory after the fact, point to the fact that although their arrest was made at liberty on the case has not yet been given to the Grand Jury. They lay stress on the point that in all probability the accused are innocent of the crime charged, and that if the child was killed that the real culprits are enjoying absolute immunity from apprehension.

One store claims that it can only get 80 pounds of sugar for every \$100 of other goods sold.

## THE DANSEY CASE.

Friends of those accused of the murder of Billy Dansey are becoming insistent that action be taken, that the accused persons be indicted and tried or exonerated. If the latter the consensus of opinion is that the county authorities should employ new men and inaugurate a new effort to get at the bottom of this mystery. It is now eight months since Billy Dansey disappeared from his home, and a trifle over six months since the arrest of Charles S. White and Mrs. Edith L. Jones, now at liberty on \$2500 and \$2000 bail respectively. A large number of persons still believe Billy Dansey is alive. A death claim on the little fellow was paid by the Metropolitan Insurance Company about three weeks ago, papers satisfactory to that company having been furnished.

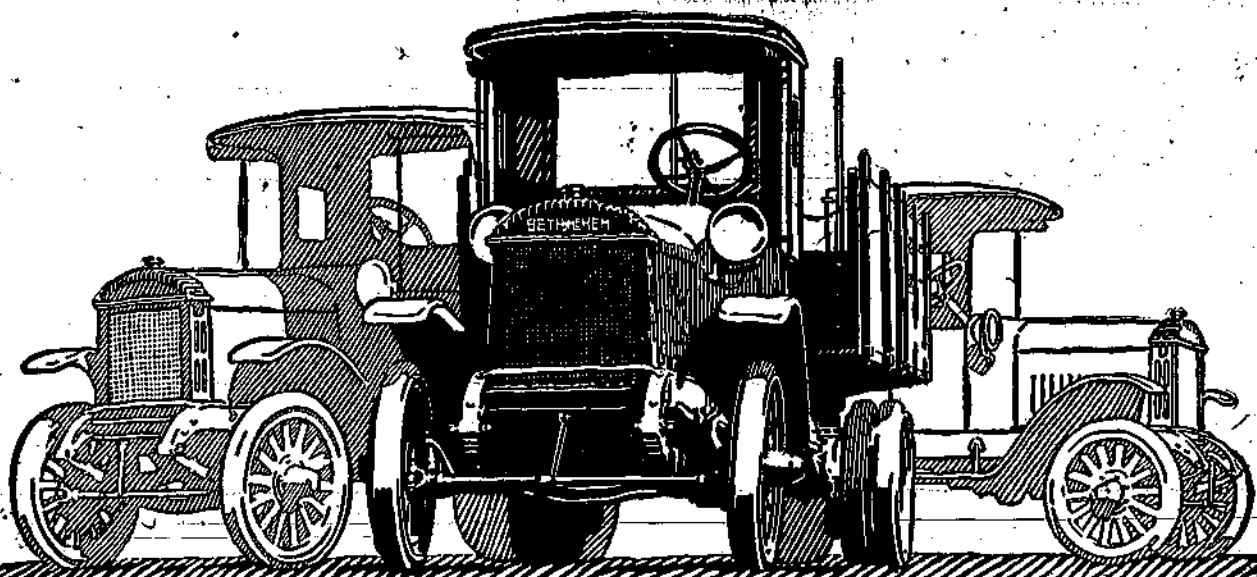

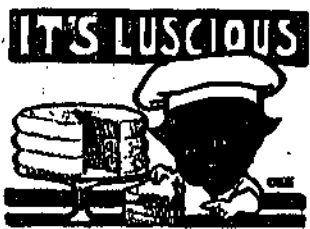

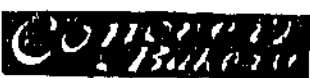

## A HORRIBLE CRIME.

What was probably the most brutal murder ever perpetrated in this section was discovered Sunday afternoon, when two Hammonton boys came across the body of Matteo Ingemi, aged 65, in the brush at a point about 100 yards from Fairview avenue, a well-traveled thoroughfare. Ingemi had been blackjacked and stabbed 45 times in the arms, neck and head. In fact, the assassin was either in a mad fury or endeavored to make identification of the body impossible. However, the body was identified as that of Ingemi by his sister, Mrs. A. Siligotta, of this place.

Under the body was a crushed chicken, the only remaining one of a dozen he had purchased late Saturday night from Mrs. Nean Rizzotto, nearest to whose home the tragedy took place. Ingemi's watch and money were missing. County Detectives Nussbaum and Fulmer and Coroner Chas. Cunningham are working on the case. Ingemi is said to have been divorced from his wife two weeks ago.

## WILL NOW ENFORCE LAW.

There was great rejoicing in this section over the upholding of the Eighteenth Amendment by the Supreme Court. This place voted license out eighteen months ago, but the uncertainty prevailing about the constitutionality of the action of Congress, and the word of a number of demagogues who were shouting that something had been pulled over on them, has made it difficult to secure complete enforcement of the law, which condition will now be rectified in case of violations. At several points near two heavy drinkers have congregated and returned to this place the worse for liquor. Federal enforcement will now likely cause these places to close up, or at least sell nothing in violation of the law. It is felt that when these places cease their illicit traffic that many tough characters will leave this section, as it is felt that access to hard drink is what has kept them here as long as they have.

## C. E. CONVENTION.

The twenty-ninth annual convention of the Atlantic County Christian Endeavor Union was held here today, June 11, in the First Presbyterian Church. Three sessions were held—morning, afternoon and evening. The Rev. Charles O. Mudge, pastor of the local Presbyterian Church, welcomed the delegates and visitors and Dr. Henry E. Jones delivered the response. Among the speakers was A. Hunt Vautier, of Philadelphia, who was a worker among the American troops at the St. Mihiel and Chateau Thierry sectors. He will speak on "A Challenge to Christian Endeavors."

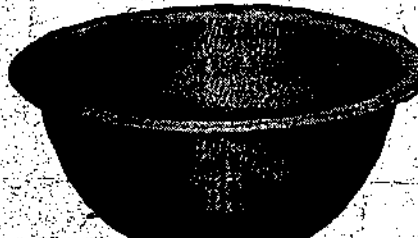

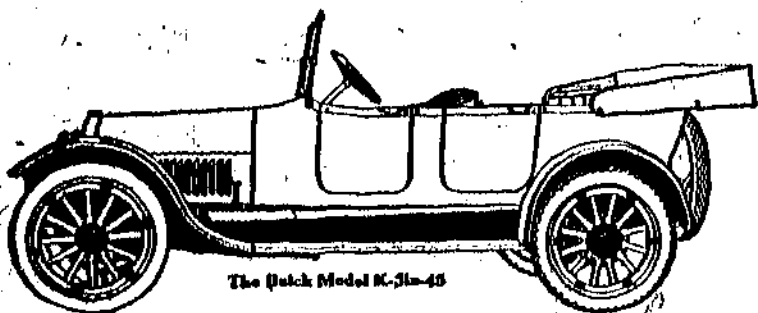
