## WILL ABATE NUISANCES.

## ARREST MADE IN MURDER.

Hammononton, N. J., June 14.—The arrest was made Sunday of Joseph Santora, aged 28, a former service man, charged with the murder of Matteo Ingomi, whose body was found near the home of Mrs. Neen Rizzotto on Sunday a week ago, has aroused the Italian colony here to a great degree, for both Ingomi and Santora are well known at this place. The body of Ingomi was found less than one hundred yards from the home of Mrs. Rizzotto, alongside a private driveway leading to the Rizzotto home, and it is highly probable that the woman heard the men engaged in a death struggle, if she did not actually witness the affair. Mrs. Rizzotto is the widow of Neen Rizzotto, a former well known contractor at this place who met death several years ago when the motorcycle he was riding crashed into a Reading flyer at Thirteenth street crossing. Ingomi is supposed to have visited the woman at night, and purchased a dozen small chickens from her, one of which was found crushed to death beneath his body. His body bore the marks of 45 knife wounds.

### THE MODERN FUNERAL

At the time of the settlement of America uncoffined interments were the rule among the humbler classes. In England "some decent coverings were deemed necessary, but this was all." It is more than probable that many of the pilgrim fathers were thus interred.

As early as 1703, however, we find record of coffins provided for the poor. Roger Williams was buried in a coffin as early as 1683, so that for the past two hundred and fifty years inhumation in coffins may be said to be the custom in this country.

Consider that a spigot that merely drips wastes 105 gallons per week.

That a leak through 1/4 of an inch opening wastes 1848 gallons per week.

That a leak through 1/8 of an inch opening wastes 5845 gallons per week.

Then at once see that any leaking spigots are put in order. Attention is called to the following regulations:

- 26. Continuous flow of water not permitted except where meter is in use.
- 27. Owners or occupants must not allow water to flow unnecessarily.
- 28. No water to be allowed to flow longer than required for immediate use, and no wilful waste or improper use is permitted.
- 30. The Commissioners may in time of scarcity or otherwise when deemed necessary restrict or regulate the quantity of water used by all consumers.

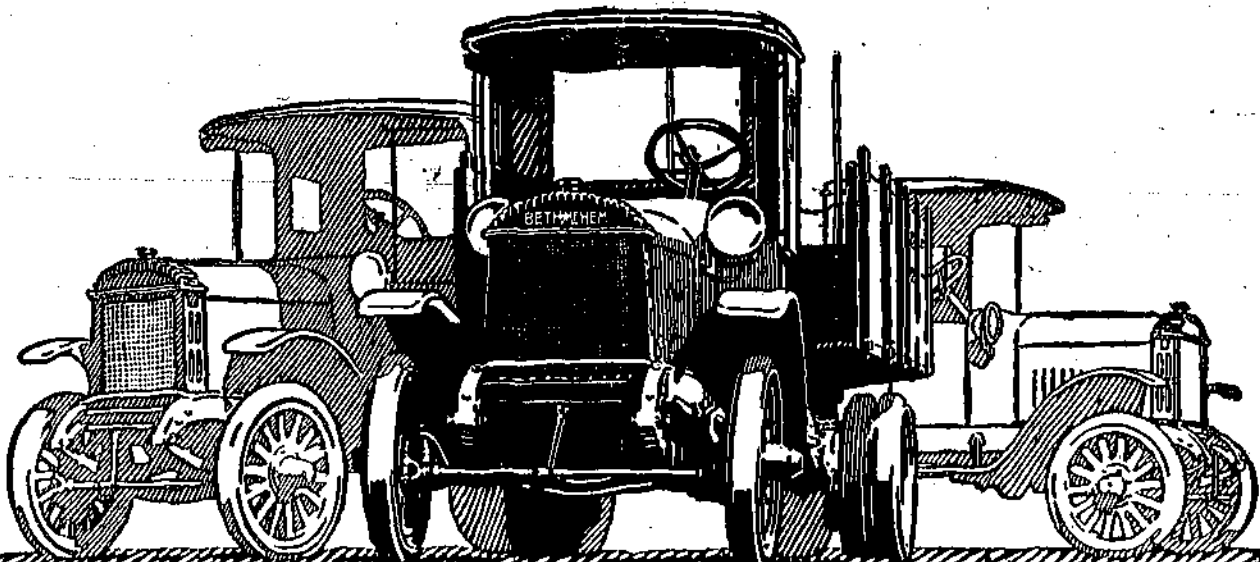
