VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURAL TEACHERS ENJOY TRIP
The annual improvement and inspection trip of the Vocational Agricultural Teachers of New Jersey was a success in every way. The teachers met from all parts of the State at Hammonton on Monday, August 16th, and visited some of the farmers with whom Mr. F. J. Freda has been working. The second day of the trip was spent in the Egg Harbor section among the farmers with whom Mr. W. G. Frisbie has been working, and on Wednesday the day was spent in the short district visiting farmers with whom Mr. H. A. Miller has been working. Thursday, Friday and Saturday were spent in Cape May County visiting men and boys with whom Mr. S. E. Stone and Mr. R. E. Reeves have been working as agricultural instructors.

Atlantic and Cape May Counties have for the past several years conducted evening classes for adult farmers who desire to improve their methods and acquaint themselves with the latest scientific research in the agricultural field. We have been practically pioneers in this particular type of work in the United States. All of the teachers who were present on this trip, together with the State Supervisor and his assistants and the Regional Director, appointed by the Federal Board for Vocational Education were greatly pleased with the results and complimented the various teachers on the magnitude and efficiency with which their work was being done with the adult farmers. Those teachers who are in Hammonton have just begun this school year work committed to them by the Federal Board. The approval of the State Supervisor and the Regional Director, Atlantic County and Cape May County teachers were attacking the problem and securing the co-operation of the farmers and the way in which the agriculture of the section was being improved through the teaching of spraying, the mixing and application of fertilizers, farm management and the various other farm problems which are being carried out and studied by the farmers and teachers. The last few years have been marked by a decided increase in the production of better quality farm products and in the upbuilding of the soil for a permanent system of agriculture. Aside from the favorable comments made by the visiting teachers, the representative of the Federal Board, in discussing the methods in the classroom and on the farm, gave his hearty approval of the work and offered some further suggestions to bring this work to an even higher plane.

The trip was not without its pleasant features. All of the men visited Atlantic City, Wildwood and Cape May, many of them for the first time. Great sport was enjoyed fishing in the Delaware Bay and a large catch resulted.

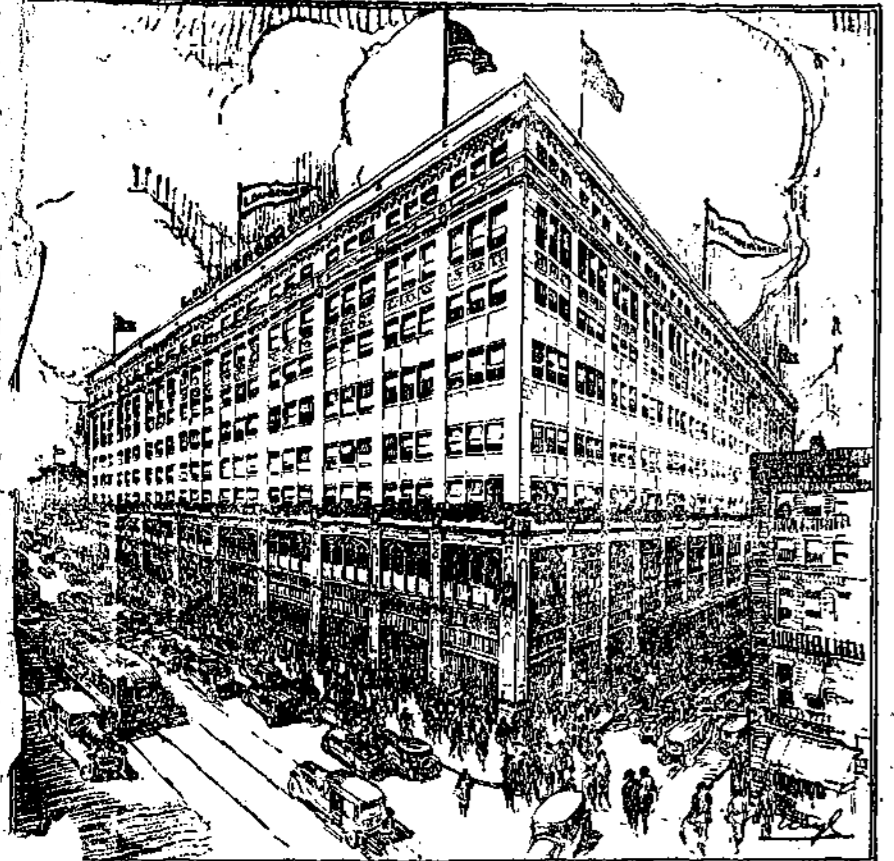

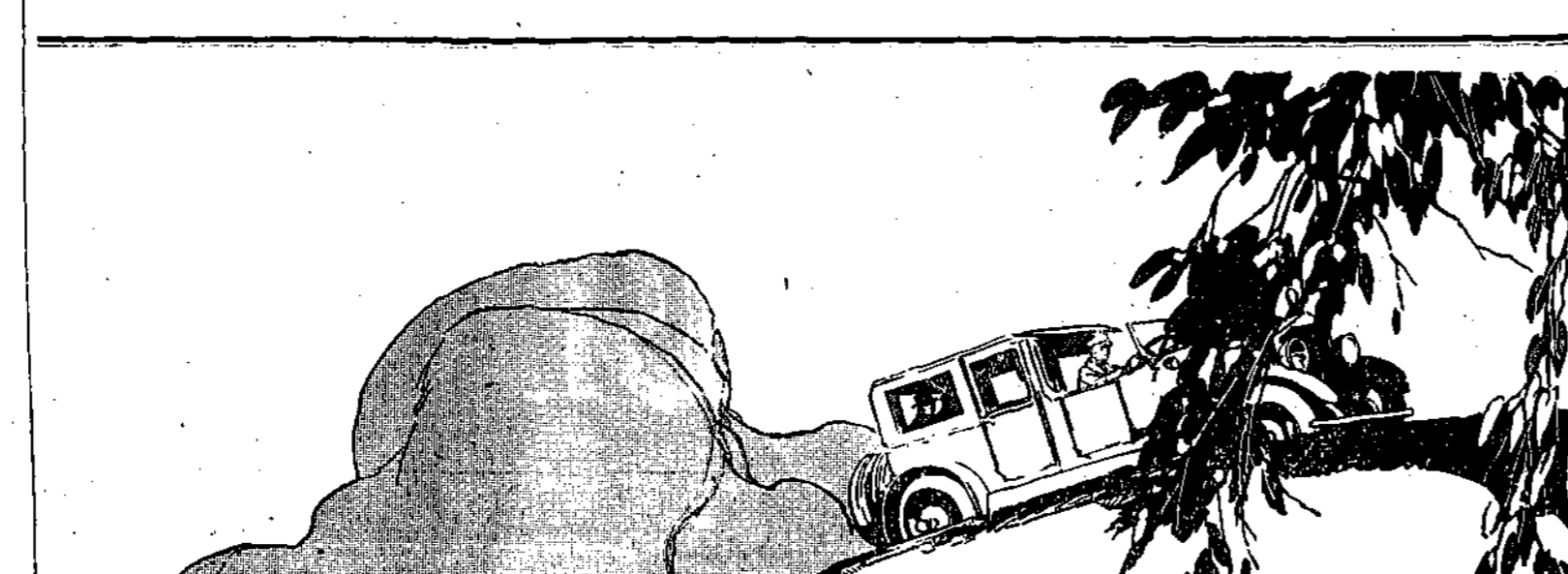

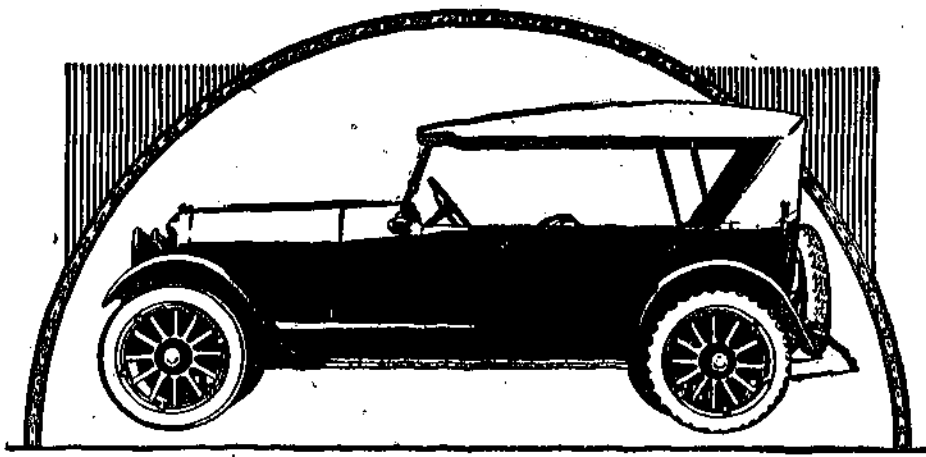
