Women Ask for Equal Rights Amendment

WASHINGTON.—The National Women's party has announced for a campaign to obtain national and state legislation removing political and legal discrimination against women.

A proposed equal rights amendment to the Federal Constitution has been drafted by counsel for the party to be introduced in the Senate by Senator Curtis of Kansas and in the House by Representative Fessenden of Ohio.

Section 1. No political, civil, or legal disabilities or inequalities on account of sex.

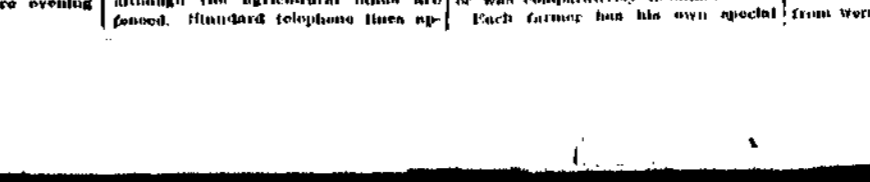
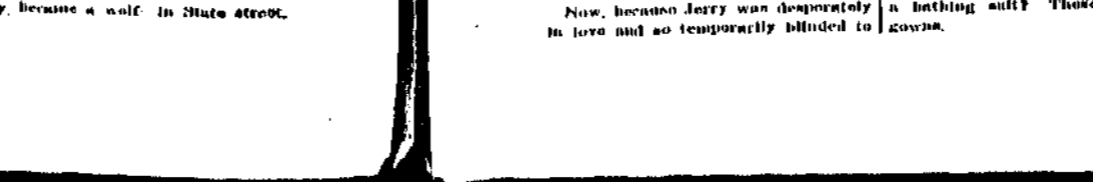
