



Meet Local Artist Nancy Graham

If you've ever visited the Reference Center, you may have noticed two paintings by local artist Nancy Graham on display. These paintings, depicting two Lenape tribesmen and Lake Lenape, respectively, were commissioned by the Lenape Women's Club, which counts Ms. Graham as a member, and donated to the library in honor of beloved educator Vincent Cantillon.





A self-taught artist, Ms. Graham has been painting for roughly 30 years, working mostly with oils and water-colors. It was a passion developed later in life but quickly became part of her daily routine—a talent she describes as simply "waiting in the wings." She often finds inspiration in the local surroundings and is most drawn to landscape and still life imagery. Although, Ms. Graham no longer exhibits her artwork, she frequently donates her pieces to charitable fundraisers. She is also more than happy to sell them to any interested parties.
